What is Atom Home?

Atom Home is an online learning and exam preparation platform for pupils aged 7-11, designed to build children's confidence with Key Stage 2 learning objectives, and to familiarise them with the style of questions they may see in the 11+ selection tests for grammar schools.

Covering English, Maths, verbal reasoning and non-verbal reasoning, children can practice 11+ questions and explore learning resources, mock tests, video tutorials, and exam preparation materials.


